Please enter your highlights of your time at Woldgate

I remember feeling nervous yet excited about starting at Woldgate after coming from a small village school. The number of classrooms, pupils, staff and individual lessons (covering such a wide variety of subjects), all seemed overwhelming. I was not used to the amount of movement around a school - would I find my way to the specific rooms for lessons in time?!

As time went on, my confidence increased, and I began to decide which subjects I enjoyed most. Maths was not one of them! I was often caught out deciding which question I would be asked. The theory didn't hold out if the pupil in front of me didn't know the answer to their own question! Another subject that I found less enjoyable was Art. I remember Mr Hazelden wrote some kind of comments on my report, considering my limited skills in Art! I particularly enjoyed Domestic Science, French and Geography, and these were the three subjects I studied at A level. Mrs Holden, Miss Oates and Mr Jones were the respective teachers for them. I became a school prefect, and then was asked to be Head Girl, which was a great privilege.

I still keep in touch with Pauline Seymour, and occasionally see a familiar face from my days at Woldgate when I am in Pocklington.

From Woldgate I went to Worcester College of Education to study Home Economics and Rural Studies for three years. After completing the time at college, I was lucky enough to attend an interview at Beverley High School, and was offered the post of Home Economics Teacher.
